1. Context

The second meeting of the ECOCONF was held from 26thto 27thJuly 2018 at the BOLTON WHITE HOTEL, in Abuja (Nigeria) in the framework of the West Africa Quality System Program (WAQSP).

2. Participants

The meeting was attended by representatives of the following institutions whose names and contacts are shown in the attached list of participants (Appendix 1):

- Representatives of ECOWAS Commission;
- ECOCONF members representing ECOWAS Member States and private sector organizations;
- The International Expert in Product Certification of WAQSP;
- Representatives of the WAQSP regional technical coordination unit.

3. Agenda

The meeting deliberated on the following main points of theagenda. The work program is attached to this report (Appendix 2).

4. Bureau

The ECOCONFChairperson chaired the meeting, supported by three rapporteurs from the following countries: Mali, Nigeria and Cape Verde.

5. Official Opening

The meeting was opened by the speech of the WAQSP'sChief Technical Advisor representing UNIDO followed by the speech of the representative of European Union Delegation in Nigeria. After, there was the speech by the ECOWAS Commissioner in charge of Industry and Private Sector Promotion followed by the speech of the representative, Federal Minister of Industry, Trade and Investment of the republic of Nigeria.

WAQSP'sChief Technical Advisor welcomed all the participants before reminding the participants the main results achieved by UNIDO especially, the regional Quality Infrastructure. He also highlighted the milestone reached by WAQSP through the setting up the regional Certification Scheme.

The representative of European Union Delegation in Nigeria was delighted to see how involved the ECOWAS Commission and ECOWAS States members were, by meeting the industrial development challenges. She stated that the work done under WAQSP is instrumental to creating the favourable conditions for attracting investments in the region thereby creating jobs and reducing poverty especially the setting up of the ECOWAS

Regional Product Certification Scheme. She ensured ECOWAS Commission of the EU's continuous commitment to develop the region.

The representative of the Federal Minister of Industry, Trade and Investment of the republic of Nigeria first welcomed all participants and partners attending the meeting. Then, he emphasized the importance of Quality for the region before congratulating, in the Name of the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, the EU and UNIDO for the results already achieved. He highlighted the key benefits of the Certification Mark for the region through consumers protection, enterprises competition, market penetration and, technical barriers removal. He ended by declaringthe meeting open.

6. The technical work

6.1. Information on the status of implementation of the action plan since the last meeting

The WAQSP's Expert in charge of conformity Assessment presented the 2017-2018 work plan implementation's status with the key outcomes as well as the next steps.

Out of 13 actions planned, 1 had been completed (8%), 8 actions on-going (62%) and actions which has not been undertaken yet (30%). The next steps are the design and protection of the Regional Mark logotype as well as its promotion. The support provided to the conformity assessment bodies will be continued. Details have been presented in appendix 3 attached to this report.

6.2. Establishment of the ECOCONF subcommittees

The ECOCONF's rules of procedure and the rules of procedure of the working groups have been reviewed. The appendix 4 presents the main changes and the final version of the documents is attached to this report.
